
We also raffled off some fun prizes to some of our sponsors during the event.


Our students work very hard and deserve recognition for their efforts and dedication and this was only possible by the continued support and generosity from all of those who contributed to our fundraiser!

IN THE SPOTLIGHT

GREEN HOUSE PROGRAM

We want to recognize Alex Brasier, Gareth Seron, William Nachbar and Steven Rodriguez of Ms. Mallory and Ms. Domenica's self-contained classes at West Orange High School. These students are doing extraordinary work in the new GREEN HOUSE PROGRAM (GHP) The students gained gardening experience at the UNICO Nicholas Vecchio Garden at Degnan Park.

The students also have sales experience as part of the Coffee Cart Delivery Program.

However, because of COVID-19 restrictions, the self-contained students were not able to take part in these programs. With the collaboration of Ms. Mallory, Ms. Domenica and case manager Mrs. Goldstein the GHP was initiated to help the students retain their sales and gardening skills. The GHP aims to provide students with hands-on skills as well as pre-vocational and transitional skills so that they can understand and adapt to the workforce.

The focus for this GHP is to develop work and life skills, in addition to providing mental, social and physical benefits.

Through the GHP, participants will improve their verbal and linguistic capabilities, as well as their ability to concentrate. It is proven that gardening strengthens coordination and fine motor skills, as well as coordination and fine motor skills.

In addition to improving communication, gardening teaches problem-solving skills, The activities of gardening have been shown to improve mood and relieve anxiety. It has also been shown to improve sensory reactions in children with Autism. Feeling the soil and smelling the plants gives the user the opportunity to explore their senses in a positive way.

The students have grown parsley, basil, cilantro, mint, potatoes, and sunflowers and they are selling them to WOHS staff.

Our best wishes go out to these students in this new program and we will continue to support and follow the results of their hard work!

18-21 WOHS TRANSITION PROGRAM

The 18-21 Transition Program at West Orange High School provides students the opportunity to work with local businesses to gain job experience in preparation for the workforce. Our goal is to make the "right match" – to provide a qualified student with a work opportunity in his or her field of interest. Educators have recognized that local businesses can often provide experiences that cannot be duplicated in the classroom. Through a Structured Learning Experience (S.L.E.), students have the opportunity to learn the job skills, and an understanding of the demand and requirements of the workplace. Students may choose to continue working in the chosen field of interest while other transition to post secondary training and education.

What You Can Do?

-Provide a work opportunity for a WOHS student interns, (paid or unpaid).

-Help ensure success in adequate job performance,
by making reasonable accommodations for students when necessary.
