THE COMMUNITY

West Orange, New Jersey, is a community of approximately 48,000 residents in the center of Essex County. The population is culturally diverse and spans all economic strata. West Orange is a primarily residential community located less than 20 miles west of New York City. Its 12.6 square miles are spread over two ridges and valleys of the Watchung Mountains. Approximately one-fourth of the land is open space, consisting of town and county parks, playgrounds, private and public golf courses and undeveloped acreage. The West Orange school system educates approximately 7,000 students in seven elementary schools, three middle schools, and one high school.

THE SCHOOL

West Orange High School has a comprehensive program with a variety of course offerings to meet the needs of its diverse student population which numbers approximately 2,000. A faculty of approximately 240 includes administration and supervisory personnel, as well as Guidance Staff, two full-time Library Media Specialists, three Nurses, two Student Assistance Counselors, and a full-time Child Study Team. The majority of the professional staff members have earned Masters Degrees and 16 have earned Doctorate Degrees.

THE CURRICULUM

West Orange High School offers an individualized curriculum of more than 200+ courses. Students must satisfy the state and local requirements for graduation in grades 9 through 12, and successfully complete a minimum of 135 credits. In addition to the basic academic courses offered at multiple ability levels, there are Honors and Advanced Placement courses in most disciplines. The interests and needs of all students are addressed by programs in career education, technology & engineering education, computer education, performing and fine arts, and English as a Second Language. The Cooperative Education Program provides students with the opportunity to study academics as well as receive on-the-job training. Students can also choose from a wide variety of electives to complement their individualized curriculum.

WOHS HIGHLIGHTS

★ According to historical high school rankings, West Orange High School was ranked as one of the best 2,000 public high schools in the nation- those that have proven to be the effective in turning out college-ready grads. West Orange High School's ranking is based on six components: graduation rate, college acceptance rate, Advanced Placement exams taken per student, average SAT/ACT scores, average Advanced Placement Scores, and the percent of students enrolled in at least one Advanced Placement course. Furthermore, The Daily Beast, Washington Post and US News & World Report have also named West Orange High School in their Top High Schools.

★ WOHS continuously strives to individualize our educational programs. In our efforts to do so, WOHS has developed the following special programs:

- AVID (The Collegiate Institute)
- IMS (Institute for Mathematics and Science)
- IH (Institute for Humanities)
- ICE (Institute for Citizen Empowerment)
- AFJROTC (Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps)

★ WOHS has 70+ co-curricular clubs and activities, including 12 Honor Societies, which focus on academic and special interests. Our Boys' Step Team holds the title of #2 in the state and #3 in the country, (Youthstep USA). In 2012, they reigned as #1 in the country. Our Girls Step Team ranks #3 top Girls Step team in the state (YouthstepUSA). Five of our students from the Honors Chamber and Concert Choir auditioned and were selected to participate in the North Jersey Regional Choir. Jubilee Choir and Step teams participated in the district-wide "Love and Unity" Festival. Jubilee Choir also performed at Google headquarters in NY for Black History month. Many students of the WOHS Band program successfully auditioned for Area, Region, and All-State Honor Ensembles. The award-winning Marching Mountaineers have previously been awarded regional, state, and national championships. For this past season, they performed at home football games and will resume a normal competitive season next year. West Orange High School hosts a Winter Color Guard which competes locally in the Mid-Atlantic Indoor Network circuit and nationally in the Winter Guard International circuit. The WOHS Indoor Percussion program is currently in its eighth year and was featured at a percussion festival at The Juilliard School in New York City as well as other local festivals. Both Jazz Ensembles, Jazz I and Jazz II, competed in local festivals and competitions. WOHS Jazz I once again qualified for the state finals. Drama Club students won awards at the virtual Speech and Theatre Association of New Jersey competition. Ms. Mapes also won a Governor's Award at STANJ. Advanced Theatre students won several awards for their presentation of *She Kills Monsters* at the Thespian Festival and senior Hailey Miller won a playwriting award. The Drama Club hosted both a winter and a spring Coffeehouse featuring new talent. The Thespian Society inducted 19 new members, awarded four Honors Bars, honored three National Honors members, Abigail Insana, Hailey Miller and Grace Soroko and awarded two International Honors to Maria Nalieth and Valentina Pappano. The Thespian Society ended the year with the student production, *The Solive It Squad*, directed by senior, Hailey Miller. The Glee Choir has raised over \$10,000 over the years for Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS through its annual Broadway Night Concert. The Tri-M Music Honors Society continues to induct 40-50 members each year who complete service hours at various music & arts events.

★ WOHS has a State of the art athletic complex complete with top-level playing fields, courts, track and facilities that are the envy of the region. WOHS has a comprehensive Athletics program that includes 29 Varsity Teams, 21 Junior Varsity Teams, and 18 Freshman Teams.

- Girls Soccer - Essex County Tournament Champions (3 of the last 4 years), #1 Team in Essex County, Essex County's Team of the Year (2021-22 and 2022-23).
- Boys Soccer State Sectional Champions & Group Finalists (2022-2023) - Ranked #4 in New Jersey (2022-2023) won its 7th sectional title since 2004.
- Football- First Sectional Championship in School History (2022-2023). Top 3 in Essex County- Ranked Top 20 in NJ, Multiple Div I scholarship offers/acceptances.
- Boys Cross Country went undefeated (12-0) and claimed the SEC Divisional Championships and regular season Championships.
- Girls Basketball team finished the year ranked top 3 in Essex County.
- Girls Lacrosse- Broke the school record for the most wins and recorded our best season in the program's history. Also won NJIGLL Colonial Division Champions.
- Boys Lacrosse- Boys Lacrosse program won its first championship in school history- NJILL Kirt Division Champions.
- Ice Hockey- NJIHL McMullen Cup Champions-first time in 20 years.
- Girls Flag Football- In their inaugural season, the team qualified for the playoffs and finished the season ranked 14th in NJ.
- Cheerleading- Won 4 team invitational tournaments during their competition season.
