#### From Manager to Consultant

In the thirteen plus years you have been a parent, you have been your children's manager. Now you must become their consultant. Influence rather than control is the role that will encourage a good relationship with your adolescents who are striving for independence, yet need guidance during these often turbulent years.

There in no one way or right way to parent a child. Every individual has his or her own personality and every family has it's own history, culture and physical configuration. However, there are a few guidelines that can help, produce positive experiences for teenagers and parents. Consistency is important. Whether the issue is use of the car, curfews, or chores around the house, it is important for everyone to know the rules and consequences for behavior in advance. Key to this is communication among family members with input from children and their parents. Such communication has the added benefit of helping everyone align their experience.

I was particularly pleased to read in a book by Dr. Michael Riera (UNCOMMON SENSE FOR PARENTS OF TEENAGERS) that "Kids are learning more by what you do than the way you say it." This statement is another way of saying "more things are caught than taught." my mothers favorite saying. This also highlights the fact that parents are built-in role models.

Parents, you have to allow your teenagers to respond in their own way and at their own pace to each situation whether it is divorce, death, poor grades or misunderstandings with friends, classmates, or teachers.

As parents, you need a lot of patience, an ability, no matter what the situation, to your teenagers behavior, with love and a willingness to accept them as they are, not as you wish them to be. If you can do that, life for all of you will be more positive as your offspring prepare for adulthood.

# 2019 ESSEX COUNTY PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE SUMMER YOUTH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The Essex County Prosecutor's Office (ECPO) is offering a five-week summer internship program beginning July 8, 2019 through August 9, 2019 for students completing their junior year by June 2019. During this exciting five-week internship program, students will be exposed to a comprehensive curriculum that includes: learning about the role and function of the Essex County Prosecutor's Office; participating in the New Jersey State Trooper Youth Week, a five day long residential program; participating in a mock trial; and interfacing with the corporate and the community-based partners on the ECPO Community Justice Advisory Board. Throughout the summer internship program, interns will be exposed to various careers in law, law enforcement and government. Interns will also participate in cultural events.

Thirty students will be chosen for the program and the ECPO Community Justice Advisory Board will make the final student selections based on the following criteria:

- ♦ Must reside in Essex County.
- ♦ Nomination by a teacher, school resource officer, religious leader etc.
- ♦ Completion of Junior year by June 2019
- Positive attitude, good reputation and sound moral character
- ♦ Good academic standing
- ♦ The ability to participate in a structured professional environment
- ♦ Good attendance
- ♦ 2 Letters of Recommendation (1 Academic and 1 Personal)
