




WEST ORANGE HIGH SCHOOL AVID PROGRAM

AVID (Advancement via Individual Determination) is a nationally recognized in-school academic program that is currently used in over 1900 schools in 30 states and 15 countries. There are more than 15 AVID sites in New Jersey. AVID graduates have attended MIT, Colorado State, Howard University, University of California, The U.S. Naval Academy, and Jersey City University to name a few of the colleges.

The AVID Program at West Orange High School is committed to increasing school-wide learning and performance. The mission of AVID is to ensure that all students, especially those in the academic middle, succeed in rigorous courses, enter mainstream activities in school, participate in college-prep activities, and become responsible participants in our democratic society.

AVID is an academic support program that prepares students for success in rigorous courses and for college. To become an AVID student, each student must apply and be accepted into the program under the criteria set below. There is a panel interviewing process. Parents of students interested in joining must be willing to participate in workshops and events.

Students in the program

- Are in the academic middle
- College/Career focused with support
- Have good attendance
- Demonstrates good citizenship in/out of the classroom
- Has the desire & individual determination to work hard and succeed
- Works well with others
- Historically underserved in four-year colleges and universities

The AVID curriculum incorporates essential habits. Research indicates the habits of highly successful students are

- Note-taking and summarizing
- Writing as a learning tool
- Inquiry strategies
- Collaborative and cooperative strategies
- Organizational and study skills

In The AVID Program, students

- are expected to advance in at least one subject area of strength
- are expected to take Honors and/or AP courses
- are expected to take a AVID elective as part of the regular school day
- focused note taking
- learn inquiry strategies for self-analysis using Bloom's Taxonomy or Costa's levels of thinking
- learn team-building strategies
- learn organizational strategies to maintain notes and binders

The AVID Program seeks to educate the “whole student.” This is achieved by coordinating six key components:
