Sonic the Hedgehog 2 introduced Tails (Colleen O'Shaughnessey), a flying fox who loves to invent things, and Knuckles (Idris Elba), a powerful rival-turned-ally. Sonic the Hedgehog 3 features Shadow (Keanu Reeves) as the main antagonist alongside Dr. Robotnik (Jim Carrey).



The Easiest Sonic Game

On the other hand, Sonic the Hedgehog 2 is the easiest game in the series. One big reason is the ability to become Super Sonic—a powered-up form that makes Sonic nearly invincible. To do this, you need to collect all seven Chaos Emeralds (special gems hidden in the game) and gather 50 rings. Once you do, Sonic becomes much faster, can jump higher, and is immune to most attacks. This makes beating the game much easier compared to other Sonic titles.

The Worst Sonic Game

In my opinion, Sonic the Hedgehog 4: Episode 1 is one of the worst games in the franchise. It was meant to be a follow-up to the classic Sonic games, but it fails in several ways. The controls feel stiff, the physics don't

Prep time: 10 Min

Cook time: 20 Min

Total time: 30 Min

Yield: 12-15 Blondies



Instructions:

Ingredients:

1 ½ cups all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

¼ teaspoon salt

1 cup packed light brown sugar

½ cup granulated sugar

¾ cup melted salted butter

2 large eggs

1 ½ teaspoons vanilla extract

1 cup pastel colored M&M's

½ cup pastel sprinkles

1. Preheat oven to 350°F and line all sides of a 9×13 baking dish with parchment paper.
2. Melt butter and let it come to room temperature.
3. In a medium sized bowl, combine the flour, baking powder and salt together.
4. In a mixing bowl fitted with a paddle attachment, combine the melted butter, brown sugar and sugar. Then add the eggs and vanilla.
5. Gently fold in the flour mixture, then fold in the M&M's and sprinkles.
6. Spread batter into the lined baking dish and smooth the top. Sprinkle more sprinkles and M&M's on top. Bake for 20-25 minutes or until lightly golden on top, rotating pan halfway through baking.
7. The middle will still be a little gooey but they will continue to bake even after you take them out of the oven.
8. Remove from oven and let cool before cutting into squares.
