

# 2017-18 Liberty Middle School 7th & 8th Grade Medical Classroom <u>Assignments</u>

## Purpose:

The purpose of the physical education medical classroom assignments are to accommodate those students who have been excused from physical education for extended medical reasons and to continue to build and enhance the literacy skills of our students.

## Directions:

For every two weeks that a student is out of PE, they are required to do one medical assignment and email it their teacher by the end of each Friday. On a shortened school week, (One week constitutes a minimum of three full school days). Your two page assignment should take a position on a particular subject, pro or con. Please defend your position with facts and why you think you are correct. Your position assignment can be on the following:

- ✤ A Sport
- ✤ A Sports Team
- ✤ A Sports Figure
- Sports Medicine
- ✤ A Controversial issue in Sports
- ✤ Any topic regarding Fitness
- ✤ Any Health related topic

#### The assignments will be as follows:

- Two double spaced typed pages (if you are on a medical due to a concussion, this assignment can be handwritten and modified on a case by case basis. However, please speak to your school nurse and PE teacher regarding this issue.
- Use 12 font, 1' margins
- Must have at least 2 references
- Include citations
- PowerPoint

#### Heading will be (cover page):

- Student Name
- PE Teacher Name
- Period & Date (Due Every Friday)
- Title

Assignments will be read and graded. Any assignment submitted without citations (embedded in the body) will not be graded which will then result in a zero. This will be your partial/full grade for PE. Points are not awarded for late assignments. Failure of a student not handing in the required amount of assignments will result in a failing grade for PE that quarter.

On the first day of the marking period please report to your PE teacher to notify him/her that you will be sending them your weekly assignments, so that they will have a contact email with you. <u>Failure to</u> do so can result in missed communication and possible failure of the marking period.

The last day of each marking period you must report to your current PE teacher for further instructions on the upcoming marking period.
