III. WEST ORANGE BOARD OF EDUCATION RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTIVE SESSION

WHEREAS, while the "Sen. Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act" (N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 <u>et seq</u>.) requires all meetings of the West Orange Board of Education to be held in public, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) sets forth nine (9) types of matters that may lawfully be discussed in "Executive Session," without the public being permitted to attend, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that one (1) issue is permitted by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) to be discussed without the public in attendance and shall be discussed during an Executive Session to be held on Monday, September 23, 2019 at 6:30 P.M, and

WHEREAS, the nine (9) exceptions to open public meetings set forth in N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) are listed below, and next to each exception is a box which will be marked when the issues to be privately discussed fall within that exception, and after each exception is a space where additional information that will disclose as much information about the discussion as possible without undermining the purpose of the exception shall be written:

 \square "(1) Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law, State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from public discussion." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:

 \square "(2) Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the federal government." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:

"(3) Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly." The nature of the matters, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality are: _____.

 \Box "(4) Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions of which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of terms and conditions with employees or representatives of employees of the public body." The collective bargaining contract(s) discussed are between the Board and______.

 \Box "(5) Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:

 \Box "(6) Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:

■ "(7) Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer." The parties to and docket numbers of each item of litigation and/or the parties to each contract discussed are and the nature of the discussion, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is: Special Education Litigation Update.

"(8) Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance, promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting." Subject to the balancing of the public's interest and the employee's privacy rights under <u>South Jersey Publishing Co. v. New Jersey Expressway Authority</u>, 124 N.J. 478 (1991), the employee(s) and nature of the discussion, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality are:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the West Orange Board of Education will go into Executive Session for the above stated reasons only; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby declares that its discussion of the aforementioned subject(s) will be made public at a time when the public's interest in disclosure is greater than any privacy or governmental interest being protected from disclosure.

As discussed, Sycamore International will physically package and remove equipment from all five storage locations listed for West Orange Public Schools, including: The Central Office, Thomas A. Edison Edison Central Six School, Liberty Middle School, Washington Elementary School, and West Orange High School.

Once protected and loaded, assets are conveyed to our secure facility in West Grove, Pennsylvania to begin the procedure of comprehensive inventory generation, complete digital and physical data destruction, and refurbishment/recycling of surplus electronics (as a whole, referred to as "processing").

Once obtained, a Sycamore staff member weighs all assets as they are unloaded from transport, and physically handles every piece of equipment received in order to enter all relevant data, including serial numbers, asset tags, and specifications into an inventory database. Equipment is sorted depending on type, asset tags and other identifiers are purged, and equipment with data storage are channeled into processing, while obsolete electronics are routed to the recycling department for breakdown into component metals and plastics. This latter group of components will be directed into a smelting facility and ultimately used in the creation of other products. No equipment received by Sycamore goes to a landfill.

Processing department staff members receive all assets with data storage (primarily desktops, laptops, servers, and individual hard drives/solid state drives), and log additional information into the inventory database, including cosmetic damage, additional specifications, and missing or damaged components. The processing staff replaces these missing or damaged internals, and performs whatever refurbishment steps are necessary to return devices to a functional state, where possible.

During this refurbishment process, all data are digitally destroyed on hard drives using a method of overwriting the entirety of the drive repeatedly with zeroes and ones, followed by a final wiping-pass, which also verifies success. Data on solid state drives is accomplished through a similar, but slightly different overwriting process, depending on the specific model. Any storage that cannot be digitally wiped successfully is mechanically destroyed in our facility. Our organization follow the NIST 800-88 standards for data security, which include the above data security controls and destruction methods, as well as extended protocols for chain of custody of information systems. For Apple products, we will coordinate with your staff to ensure they can successfully dis-enroll all devices

from your DEP system (if applicable) ideally prior to equipment removal, as well as ensuring iCloud removal, which is necessary for effective data destruction.

After all equipment received has been logged, separated for recycling or refurbishment, and all data destroyed, a final quality control process is conducted to ensure everything is captured. Once verified, our personnel generate a comprehensive audit of all materials received, which includes individual device information and line-item values paid to the school for each unit. This audit is remitted back to your organization, and is accompanied by a document guaranteeing data destruction and responsible e-waste recycling, as well as the check for all materials received. The Serialized Inventory Report is an Excel Spreadsheet with approximately 3 sheets. The first sheet is a summary sheet, which will include the total amount of compensation we provided for the project as well as a list of the compensation provided for each model, and the total gross weight of the material received from the District. The second sheet contains a serialized list of devices deemed functional, with the model specifications for each device and the processing notes on the condition each device was received. The third sheet lists the material we recycled by serial number, device specification, and notes on the condition each device was received. We will also provide a Certificate of Data Destruction, which certifies that all equipment has been recycled to federal, state, and local requirements and regulations.

Payment and documentation are provided typically within 60 days following a removal.

Board of Education Offices Edison Middle School Gregory Elementary School Hazel Avenue Elementary School Kelly Elementary School Liberty Middle School Mount Pleasant Elementary School Redwood Elementary School Stagg Field St. Cloud Elementary School Washington Elementary School West Orange High School

Based on our discussions and site visits we clearly understand the objectives of your District.

El Associates has been providing professional design services to the K-12 educational community for over 75 years. We have a highly integrated and professional in-house staff of educational planners, architects and engineers of all disciplines to support all of your facility and program needs. In addition to West Orange, El currently serves as the District Architect/Engineer for many school districts in New Jersey including Summit, South Orange-Maplewood, Union Township, Denville, Dover, Hillsborough, Piscataway, Mendham Township, Little Falls, Metuchen, Demarest, Newton, High Point, Kittatinny and Hasbrouck

Heights, many of whom we have assisted with facility assessments and Long Range Facilities Plan Updates. Our team is highly qualified to execute this assignment on your behalf.

We are prepared to commence work promptly on this assignment following receipt of your Board Resolution referencing approval of this proposal. Thank you for this opportunity to continue to be of service to the West Orange Board of Education.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

El Associates has prepared schematic design services covering the following four categories of work: HVAC system upgrades at eleven facilities; electrical system distribution improvements related to the HVAC system upgrades; selected roof replacements at nine schools; and a retaining wall replacement at the Washington Elementary School. As part of those services we conducted targeted site visits with our architects and engineers to the subject facilities to confirm the existing conditions, prepared cost estimates covering the proposed improvements and updated the District LRFP to include those items. The District has identified additional needs covering security upgrades, elevators, ADA upgrades, brick repointing and playground improvements which were also added to the LRFP update as part of our services.

The purpose of this assignment is to identify deficiencies that may exist and have not been covered under the previous services.

LONG RANGE FACILITY PLANNING: THE NEW PARADIGM

Recent challenges to school funding due to historical cuts in state aid and state mandated tax levy caps have had a dramatic impact on school district planning and priority decision making. Capital projects designed to maintain and upgrade aging, unsafe and energy inefficient school facilities have had to be delayed or eliminated entirely from District planning in spite of a recent U.S. Department of Education report that indicates "one third of schools across America are in need of extensive repairs or replacement." In addition to meeting the building infrastructure needs of aging school facilities, Districts need to address ever increasing energy costs, new challenges to school security and the changing paradigm of 21st Century Teaching and Learning.

SCOPE OF WORK NOTES

Our proposal is based upon the following assumptions and qualifications:
