Dear West Orange Public School Families,

I hope this message finds you well and easing into the month of October. In the effort to keep you apprised of district and local informational items, I offer you the following details.

Change in Process for Requesting Student Loaner Chromebooks at the Elementary and Middle Schools Please note that the process for requesting student loaner chromebooks has changed. Parents requesting a loaner chromebook for a student in grades K-8 should submit a formal request via the building principal in their child's school. The process works as follows:

- 1. The parent submits a request for loaner chromebook for one of the following reasons:
  - a. COVID (close contact/positive test)
  - b. COVID (travel)
  - c. Student does not have a computer at home
- 2. The building principal or designee will submit a request to the Technology Department
- 3. The Technology Department will prepare a loaner chromebook for the student and then notify the parent/guardian via email when the chromebook is ready for pick up.

<u>Please note:</u> students who are provided with a loaner chromebook due to quarantine as a result of close contact, positive test, or travel, must turn in the chromebook to their school upon returning from quarantine.

Parents/Students who receive a loaner chromebook and need technical assistance should complete the <a href="Parent/Student Technology Request Form">Parent/Student Technology Request Form</a>.

## Elementary Parent/Teacher Conferences-Virtual October 19, 20, 21

The district has made the decision to conduct these conferences virtually. In reviewing our health and safety protocols, the district would be unable to adequately sanitize the classroom spaces between the departure of students and the commencing of parents/guardians traversing the halls and school classrooms. Additionally we have received positive feedback that the virtual conference provides a degree of convenience as it allows consideration of work schedules. Telephonic conferences can be requested by parents that do not have the ability to video conference from home. Please mark your calendars as these dates are also scheduled "early dismissal days" for elementary students.
