**Vision:** The West Orange World Language and ESL programs will offer **exemplary programs** that develop **globally competent, multilingual**, and **culturally responsive** citizens.

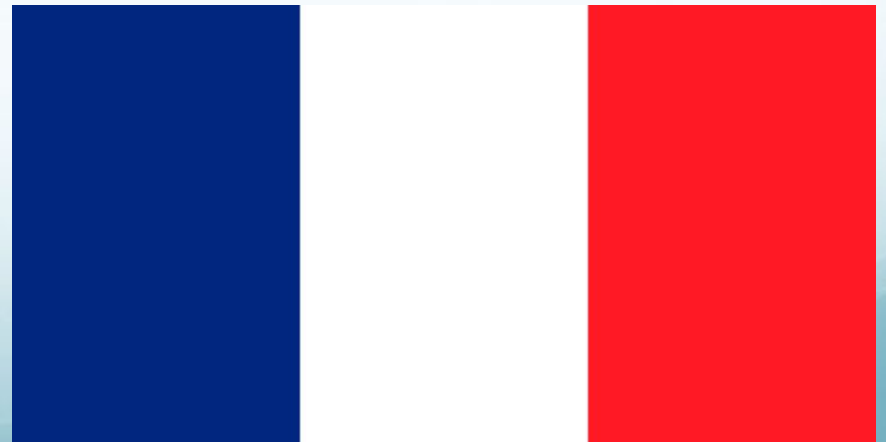

# Moving on from Eighth Grade World Languages

- It is recommended for students to continue with the language they studied in 7th and 8th grade to gain high levels of proficiency. However there are opportunities for students to begin a new language in 9th grade.
- Differentiated instruction is provided for all learners in every language classroom.

# 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Options

- Start level one of any language
- Eligible to continue level 2 in a language begun in 8<sup>th</sup> grade upon demonstration of adequate proficiency
- Heritage screening for Native Spanish speakers takes place in 8<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Screening for French, Italian and Chinese also takes place to see if students can begin at higher levels of these languages in 9<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Screening continues in 9<sup>th</sup> grade for new students.
- Class levels are based on students' grades, teacher recommendations, and student proficiency levels.

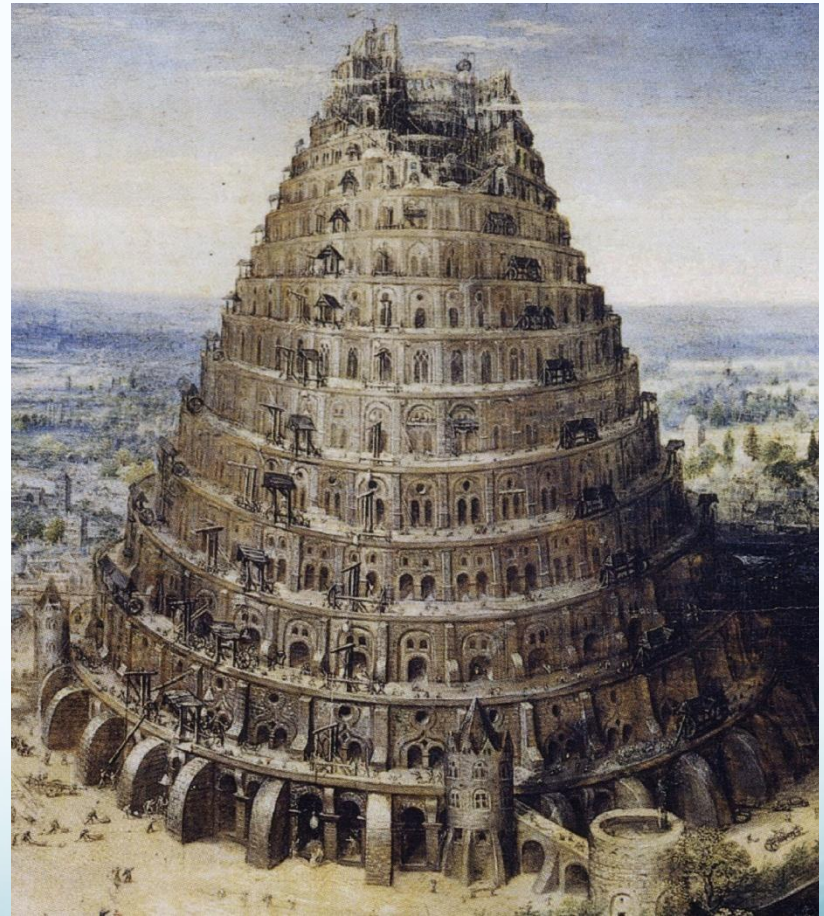
