Program Description

The Institute for Citizen Empowerment (I.C.E.) is a program that makes citizenship the central theme of the education of our students. The Institute for Citizen Empowerment Small Learning Community is designed to help students develop the knowledge, skills, attitudes and experiences to become active and effective citizens in American society.

Course Sequence

This Social Studies based small learning community begins with the student’s application in his/her freshman or sophomore year, and enrollment in the Institute for Citizen Empowerment in the following year. Students will move as a unit within their I.C.E. classes through their senior year.

Each year, students in the I.C.E. will take 5-10 credits within the small learning community. By the end of their senior year, I.C.E. students will have taken 25-30 credits in the I.C.E. Small Learning Community. The course pairings each year will be as follows.

10th grade	5 credits	US History I - I.C.E. or Honors US History I - I.C.E.
	5 credits	Law: Rights and Responsibilities - I.C.E. elective
11th grade	5 credits	US History II - I.C.E. or Honors US History II - I.C.E. or AP US History
	5 credits	History of Race, Class, Gender and Ethnicity - I.C.E. elective
12th grade	2.5 - 5 credits	Power and Politics - I.C.E. or AP Government and Politics
	2.5 - 5 credits	Social Studies Elective or AP Social Studies course
