## **Course Overview**

This course ends with a unit on economics, to begin developing the skills needed to be productive and conscious citizens.

Unit	Estimated Class Time	Overview
Unit 1 Our School, Our Community	10 weeks	In this first unit, students will develop an understanding of community and the roles and responsibilities of each individual in a community.
Unit 2 Cultural Traditions	10 weeks	In this unit, students will foster an appreciation and respect for cultures and cultural traditions, while developing a deeper understanding of their own culture and our collective American culture.
Unit 3 Past and Present	8 weeks	In this unit, students will study how life changes throughout time.
Unit 4 Looking at Our World	8 weeks	In this unit, students will use geographic tools and concepts to read maps, locate places in the world, and understand the changing seasons.
Unit 5 Economics	4 weeks	In this unit, students will use economic concepts to determine the differences between needs and wants as well as goods and services.
